

## **2. Workshops for language practice:**

### **2.1 3, 2, 1 ACTION!**

Through a series of ice-breakers and warm-up activities, students are encouraged to speak English whilst being introduced to the basic elements of theatre. This workshop is physical and uses costumes as well as props. Students work in groups and have the opportunity to create and present short scenes on stage. (from Class 5 and up)

### **2.2 Once upon a time...**

Students can receive advice on how to stage their own pieces or are given impulses to create their own during the session. This is an impulse-based workshop where students are given the chance to work with a piece of text, music or pictures. All materials are provided as well as props and costumes. Focus is placed on creating a character and building a simple story. (from Class 7 and up)

### **2.3 Explore! More than a theatre tour.**

Exploration of the English theatre as a location for learning English. Students receive a guided tour of the theatre and get to take a peek behind the scenes, seeing areas not open to the public. Students learn by doing as they partake in realistic, location-based role-plays from the box-office to backstage. (from class 9 and up)

### **2.4 Let's get physical**

Telling stories with the body only can be exciting to watch and a challenge to do. This workshop brings the body and its movement to the centre of our attention. In order to deepen its expressive qualities we'll be playing games and enact examples of movement theatre and physical theatre.

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
